PRESIDENT'S
REPORT

Introduction

After five years of study and the collection world-wide of data on unique awards and prizes created to recognize human achievement, the International Congress of Distinguished Awards (ICDA) issued in March, 1999, its first "Official Roster of Distinguished Awards." This was the first time any organization in the world had attempted to evaluate and officially designate the world's most noteworthy and newsworthy awards.

Presented to those in attendance at ICDA's 4th annual conference on "The World of Awards," held at the DoubleTree Hotel in Miami, Florida, February 24-27, 1999, the Roster of 116 award programs and a total of 186 separate awards made quite an impression on those present. The chosen awards were presented in various tables revealing their official name, the value of the awards in US dollars, their age, the fields in which they are presented, and the country where they are located.

By analyzing these tables, much was revealed about the world of big awards and trends in award creation, growth, and presentation across the entirety of the 20th century. And it was also possible to see that award giving involves millions of dollars and is something that is particularly practiced in the United States.

In the introduction to that report and publicly in Miami, I described the first "Official Roster" as a work in progress that would be refined, honed, and corrected each year with the latest data available. I also indicated that ICDA was planning to produce other rosters of awards, including reports on fellowship award programs, professional association award programs, and corporate award programs as an aid to professionals working in these realms and to observers of these award programs.

Almost immediately, one of our colleagues, Rebecca Irvin of the impressive Rolex Awards for Enterprise (Geneva, Switzerland), stepped forward indicating that she was in need of current and reliable information about corporate award programs. Fortunately for ICDA and our ambitions to understand the world of awards, opportunity and need at once coalesced. Indeed, in answering pressing questions for Rolex, we have been able to move much more quickly than we anticipated a few months ago into a full scale

analysis of corporate award sponsorship and presentation around the world.

Looking at Corporate Award Giving

While ICDA heretofore has concentrated primarily on identifying stand alone "distinguished awards" in the realms of the arts and humanities, science and technology, medicine and humanitarianism, literature and religion, peace and the environment, in this examination of corporate award giving we have expanded our focus considerably. In this report we have also included sports and entertainment and many forms of competitions sponsored by corporations.

From the outset, however, we need to make some observations about what we set out to study and what we did not intend to include. The following is a study of corporate sponsored awards given externally from the company for some type of human achievement. We are not here interested in internal corporate award programs where corporate officers recognize individuals for productivity, new business ideas, and the like.

The achievements thus honored are mainly not directly related to the main business thrust of the corporation. Although as one examines dozens and dozens of corporate awards, it is quickly noted that chemical companies tend to sponsor awards for achievement in chemistry; automotive parts suppliers, auto races and competitions; and publishers, good journalism and quality books.

By the same token included here are those sums of money provided by corporations for cash prizes to recipients. For example, McDonald's Corporation might spend a great deal of money promoting its Awards of Excellence; Sara Lee its Frontrunner Awards; or General Motors its Cancer Research Medals. But the amounts reported in this study are only those cash prizes that go to award recipients or, in some cases, to the recipients' designees.

Early on we noticed some phenomena about corporate award giving that caused us to gather some types of data that did not apply to other realms of award giving. For example, we noticed a tendency for corporations to "sponsor" awards that would then be given through or by an entirely different organization. We thus sought to identify those other organizations and to identify whether they were foundations, voluntary societies (also professional associations), universities, museums, and the like.

We also noticed that while some corporations choose the recipients of awards and then present their prizes directly, other corporations make use of their corporate foundations in

choosing and presenting awards. We thus tried to determine which corporations follow which practice. Some that choose recipients and present prizes directly are Pfizer, Sara Lee, and Rolex itself.

But in making that judgement a bit of guess work inevitably came into the picture. For example, some corporations--such as Allied Signal, Asahi Glass, Bristol-Myers Squibb, General Motors, and others--have their own corporate foundations right in their corporate headquarters and use these foundations as the vehicle for presenting awards.

In other instances there is a considerable distance or fire wall between corporations and the foundations they have spawned. Examples might be the Conrad Hilton Foundation and the Burroughs Wellcome Fund. Depending upon the extent of the identification of such organizations with their corporate founders, we chose in each case either to put them in or leave them off of this study of corporate award giving.

Certain other well-known corporate names have been left off of the corporate list because the awards bearing those names were created totally separately from the corporation itself. Examples of these would be the Heinz Awards of the Heinz Family Foundation of Pittsburgh and the Heineken Prizes (except one of them created by the corporation) of the Royal Academy of Arts and Sciences in Amsterdam.

As we observed the corporate award culture ever more closely, we also found another phenomenon that does not appear in other realms of award giving: a tendency to discontinue awards under changing circumstances. In some cases it is clear that fortunes of the corporation dictated a retreat. In other cases we suspect changing interests of CEO's and, indeed, the succession of CEO's. Certainly this tendency to discontinue is something rarely encountered in other realms of award giving.

Scope of the Survey

In conducting this study we identified 105 corporations that give or have given awards. The list of corporations came from the existing files of ICDA and from brainstorming with other members of ICDA.

But the bulk of the corporate names came from the indexes and lists of Awards, Honors, & Prizes, 15th edition, 1999, produced by Gale Research. While this is a good tool for use in looking at various realms of awards, it is also difficult to use due to outdated information and frequent inconsistencies in the identification of awards and corporate sponsors. But used cautiously it helped to fill out parts of the picture of

corporate award giving.

We looked at more than 500 awards presented by these 105 corporations and ended up eliminating all but 160 separate awards presented by 82 corporations world wide. Excluded from the study were the following:

1. All internal corporate awards.
2. Most awards under \$1,000 and some that were \$1,000 after the pattern of giving by a corporation had been demonstrated.
3. All awards that have been discontinued, although a separate list of these appear below.
4. All awards where there is no current contact information for the sponsoring or administering organization.
5. All awards presented by foundations that are not, in fact, corporate foundations.
6. Awards co-sponsored by pools of corporations.

In some cases, corporations may have initiated an award and later stopped sponsoring it. Only currently recognized sponsors are included in the study.

Corporate Awards

Corporations sponsor and/or present a vast number of awards in many fields of interest, mainly with cash prizes, and usually on an annual basis.

Chemical, petrochemical, publishing, and technological companies usually present the most number of awards, but--with a few exceptions--their cash prizes also tend to be fairly small:

Note: The numbers (1) or (2) beside certain corporations in the foregoing table represent two clearly distinguishable levels and types of award-giving by the indicated corporation.

Corporate Awards by Year of Creation

More than half of the existing corporate awards (78) were established during the last 20 year period (since 1979). Another 65 awards preexist that time. However, only 10 awards derive

from before 1950. And, most of those--except for the exceptional Pillsbury BAKE-OFF award of \$1 million are small science and technology awards. For another 15 corporate awards, the date of creation is not available (indicated by "0" in tables below).

An interesting sidelight on the date of creation of corporate awards is that we have data on only 8 corporate awards created after 1990. This is unusual compared to other types of awards, suggesting that corporations are not as effective as other organizations in making their awards known to the general public. Given the pace at which new corporate awards were created in the previous decade from 1980-1989--64 new awards--it is unlikely that there has been a tapering off in the creation of new awards.

Country of Awards

As in the case of awards in general, most corporate awards are sponsored or presented by companies located in the United States.

In the case of our previous study of distinguished awards, almost half of those awards are located in the United States. With regard to corporate awards here identified a whopping total of 120 out of the 160 separately listed awards or 75 percent are from the United States.

The nations here represented with individually listed awards are as follows:

It seems clear that corporate award giving is something that is more highly practiced in the United States than anywhere else in the world.

With regard to who gets all of the corporate awards, there is regrettably no collected information available at this time.

However from impressionistic reading of lists of award recipients, it would be our conclusion that most U.S. awards go to Americans as well as a good number of those corporate awards located in other nations. In this respect the Rolex Awards are distinctive in finding worthy recipients in all points of the globe.

Award Fields

Corporate awards fall roughly into the same realms as our prior study of distinguished awards. In that study science, the arts, and technology ranked higher than other fields. And so do they among corporate awards.

However, medicine ranks much higher among corporate awards than among distinguished awards. And those fields that get much less attention among corporations than from distinguished awards are humanitarianism, the environment, and--completely absent from corporate awards--religion.

With regard to sports, it is interesting to note that while corporations widely use sporting events for advertising and media sponsorship, this field is relatively minor in their realm of award giving.

Some fields that appear in corporate award giving--not evident in other realms of awards are agriculture, cooking, exploration, and culture. Here again, Rolex is distinctive for its pioneering efforts to focus on exploration and culture.

But, clearly, corporate award giving is quite diverse and looks at realms overlooked in other realms of awards.

Award Responsibility

It is in the realm of responsibility for the selection of award recipients and the actual presentation of sponsored awards that corporations are quite different from other award-giving institutions.

A preponderant number of corporations sponsor awards through non-profit membership organizations--more often than not professional associations--rather than giving awards directly themselves or by giving through their corporate foundations.

A few major caveats on this finding, however, are that professional associations have long looked toward corporations to sponsor and fund professional recognition awards and many of the awards in this data base are of that nature. Moreover, the practice of sponsoring awards through other organizations is specifically a practice of US corporations more than corporations in other countries.

But it is also evident that corporations have often seen it as useful and efficient to delegate the selection of award recipients and the presentation of awards to organizations that might be viewed as unbiased and objective in their selection procedures.

Discontinued Corporate Awards

As has been noted in the foregoing there there is some record of corporations discontinuing certain awards or discontinuing their sponsorship of certain awards. There follows a partial list of discontinued awards indicating, as appropriate, the nature of the award and the amount of the prize:

American Airlines (several ski competition awards ended in

1996)

Bertelsmann Foundation (Bertlesman Prize was 300,000 German marks [\$175,000 US] honoring contributions to the development of a democratic society in Germany)

CIBA-GEIGY (several minor chemical awards)

duPont (several minor chemical awards)

Eastman Kodak Company (sports awards and Ms. Photogenic competition)

Glaxo (minor chemical awards)

Kodak (2 film competitions)

MCI (2 awards for disabled sports competitors)

Merck (2 minor chemical awards)

Mobil (minor arts administration award in Australia)

NCR (27,500 UK pound [\$46,000 US] book award for non-fiction)

Unilever (2 annual major science awards of \$160,000)

UNYSIS (ended support for \$100,000 annual Philadelphia Liberty Medal after five years in 1998; though the award continues)

Upjohn (minor chemical awards)

Volvo (discontinued support of 6 separate player of the year awards in tennis)

Westinghouse Electric Corp. (high school science competition awards begun in 1942, 10 awards at \$50,000 each)

Xerox (award for outstanding city mayors)

As already noted such changes in sponsorship seem to derive from the changing fortunes of corporations, evolving business and public interests of corporations, and the exodus and arrivals of new chief executives with their own special interests.

Other Questions

This summary analysis and the following cross-tabulations of data on corporate awards represent only the tip of the iceberg in

examining the world of corporate awards.

In our efforts to understand corporate awards, we registered other data beyond what is reported in this summary including all of the following data fields:

In that our data is manipulable to answer specific questions not here addressed, we invite other queries as we seek to make these data of important use, not only to its original sponsor--Rolex Watch Company of Geneva--but to other directors of award programs and the many observers, participants, and award recipients in the world of awards.
