Introduction

In March 1999, the International Congress of Distinguished Awards (ICDA) issued its first annual "Official Roster of Distinguished Awards." The Roster was accompanied by a number of data tables classifying more than 116 award programs according to the age of their creation, the US dollar cash value of their prizes, the general field of their award giving, and the nation where they were located. Those award programs presented a total of 186 individual prizes, most with cash awards of \$100,000 or more in US dollar equivalents.

These awards represented the cream of the crop of more than 29,000 known awards, honors, and prizes as compiled and listed in a reference work with the fullest listing of awards world-wide as published by Gale Research. ICDA acknowledged in this first report the probable omission of many worthy award programs—unknown to it or that did not fit the nature and format of data at that time being gathered. We also acknowledged that we had not yet figured out how to include performance competitions and fellowship awards in our data base.

We began to correct these omissions in a brief update of the Roster in 2000. Our first OFFICIAL ROSTER which we think fairly represented nearly all of the world's most distinguished awards was issued in 2001. It was probably the first comprehensive and reliable report on the current status of the truly most distinguished awards. That report included many awards from Europe, Asia, and

also the US that had not previously come to our attention. It also included the great abundance of new awards that had emerged in the last years of the 20th century.

This report attracted much attention with articles in the national newspaper press—Miami Herald, New York Times, Philadelphia Inquirer and in the professional press The Scientist and several European science journals and magazines. Word about our OFFICIAL ROSTER even reached the hallowed halls of the British Broadcasting Company which produced a television documentary based on our work for the award-winning documentary series “Arena.” The resulting documentary titled “And the Winner Is . . .” first aired in the UK in November 2002 and will most likely appear in the coming months on PBS in the US.

We are now most pleased to present the 2003 edition of the OFFICIAL ROSTER OF DISTINGUISHED AWARDS—an even more tidied, fuller, and current report on the world’s most distinguished awards.

The Official Roster of Distinguished Awards IV, 2003

The 2003 OFFICIAL ROSTER OF DISTINGUISHED AWARDS is a good advance over our previous rosters. We have received extensive feedback from award directors and interested parties all over the world. We have also made extensive use of the internet to check webpages of many organizations and have frequently notified award organizations that their webpage information is badly out of date. Even the most sophisticated award organizations sometimes forget how old their internet information may be.

The 2003 Roster contains a total of 127 award programs presenting a total of 798 individual awards and prizes either on an annual or biennial—and in a few cases on a triennial or quadrennial—basis. This is a somewhat modest increase over our 2001 Roster which contained a total of 122 award programs and a total of 763 individual prizes and awards.

With the downturn in national and international economies over the past two years, there has been a complementary slowing in the creation of new awards. There are, nevertheless, some important new additions to the field as follows:

***All of these new prizes are awarded in US \$ amounts so that currency conversions and changes in values do not affect the US \$ value of these awards.**

In addition to these new inclusions on the OFFICIAL ROSTER OF DISTINGUISHED AWARDS, other older awards and a number of new awards have been suggested to us for consideration. These include several historic awards begun in the 18th century as well as some other quite new prizes. We will be looking at these very closely over the coming year.

ICDA's OFFICIAL ROSTER is thus an ever developing, refined, and accurate barometer of what it takes to be an internationally distinguished award. Readers are invited to take a look at our current ROSTER on our webpage at www.icda.org and make suggestions of awards that should be considered for listing on the ROSTER and for the correction of errors in current listings.

Increase in Awards and Cash Amount of Prizes

Despite the prevalent economic conditions that have slowed the creation of new awards and prizes over the past few years, there have been sizeable increases in the amount of some awards and in the number of awards being given by some award programs. Among those perhaps most worthy of note are the following:

***The US\$ equivalent of these prizes was determined on April 30, 2003, based on the conversion value of the stated amount of these prizes on that date and not the conversion value on the date the awards were announced. While it would be useful to know the value on the dates awarded such data gathering is beyond the scope of this report.**

Amounts Awarded and Aggregate Costs of Awarding Distinguished Awards

If the amount of money issued by the 127 distinguished award program on an annual basis be summed, the total cash outlay per annum in awards in the year 2002 (expressed in US\$) was \$84,040,660. This represents approximately a 23% increase in the amount of money awarded in a two year period—a phenomenal increase.

Since there were a total of 798 individual awards given, the average amount of each award presented was \$105,314, an increase of 18% per award over the 2000 amount of \$86,500 per award. This is even more phenomenal since there are quite a few awards considered distinguished which do not present any cash prizes. The increase in average awards is due to the rapid increase in the size of all awards and the creation of new awards at a higher level than many past awards.

One might conclude that \$84 million is a relatively small sum in the contemporary world of multi-billion dollar corporations (too many of which have proved to be smoke and mirrors!). But this \$84 million is only the tip of the iceberg. It does not include the costs of administering and presenting these awards; nor does it include the other 29 or 30,000 awards that make up the world of awards—at least a \$2 billion mostly overlooked world wide cottage industry.

Relative Age of Distinguished Awards

As noted in ICDA's 1999 and 2001 ROSTERS, the creation of awards—especially those with large cash prizes—is a relatively recent phenomenon. And the pace in the creation of new large price awards is accelerating. A thumb nail sketch follows:

More than 50% of all major award programs have been created since 1981. But given the fact that most award programs are developed somewhat in isolation without knowledge of other awards on the same topic or field, there is a time gap between conceptualization of a new award and its appearance on information data bases including that of ICDA.

All of the data available to ICDA indicates that award creation continues apace, although informed by world economic conditions.

Awards by Country

The predominance of the United States, Japan, and Sweden in the number of awards given and the amount of cash prizes continues. The relative rank nations in the giving of awards listed on our 2003 ROSTER is as follows:

The relative amount of awards and award funds coming from various countries was little changes from 2001 except in the case of Israel and Norway where total amounts increased six fold and two fold respectively. The most remarkable increase was in the United States where the total amount awarded grew from \$40,440,000 in

2001 to \$53,542,600 in 2003. That was nearly a 25% increase in an already robust amount of awards compared to the rest of the world.

The US total of \$53,542,600 in 2003 represented almost 64% of all the distinguished awards given in the world. The United States continues to present more cash in distinguished awards than the rest of the world combined.

Awards by Field

ICDA has again tried to categorize the world's distinguished awards in some rather broad fields of specialization and achievement. Although some have criticized us for overlooking specific topics of distinguished awards such as literary criticism, music composition, and invention, we have continued to group these discrete topics respectively under literature, the arts, and technology. A few fields just fit nowhere, such as planetary exploration, so we have created some discrete categories that will not show much representation in our report on awards by field.

The major fields are as follows:

The fields of awards have changed somewhat dramatically since 2001. While the arts increased by 21% from \$20.8 million to \$26.3 million, awards in the sciences increased by 41% from \$14.9 million to \$25.3 million. Most other realms increased by little more than 10% except in engineering where the addition of the new Russ

Prize at the National Academy of Engineering in the United States greatly advanced that realm.

US\$ Dollar Value of Awards

As indicated above we have calculated the value of all prizes based on the US dollar value as of April 30, 2003. And the basis for our calculation was the stated value in whatever currency when the award was last given. Given the tidal changes in international economies and the rate of exchange of various monetary systems, this inevitably means that our values may not be the same as they were when awards were announced.

One good example of this is the relative value of the renowned Nobel prizes which are awarded in Swedish krona (10 million krona) and of the Templeton Prize for Progress in Religion which is awarded in British pounds (700,000 pounds). At the time these awards were announced (fall/winter 2002) the Templeton Prize exceeded in US\$ equivalent the amount of the Nobel prizes. But since we base our relative value of various prizes on the US\$ equivalent at a particular date during the year (this year April 30, 2003) and since the exchange rate between dollar, pound, and krona has altered dramatically in the intervening period, the value of these and other prizes may appear to be skewed.

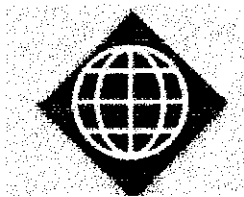

As indicated by this impressive list of new and growing awards, the new plateau for a major award—in terms of cash amount—is \$500,000. There are now 66 prizes at \$500K and above. If the specialized Packard and MacArthur Fellowship Awards are removed there are still 25 awards in this realm.

There are 89 awards between \$101K and \$250K now—remarkable in that in 1991 when ICDA began gathering information on awards there were not more than 25 awards at the level of \$100K and above. Awards have been a major growth realm in the 1990s and in the early years of the 21st century.
